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**APPLICATION FOR THE GRANT OF A HOUSE TO HOUSE COLLECTION PERMIT  
SAVANNA RAGS INTERNATIONAL LTD**

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**Report of the Service Director (Community Protection and Well Being)**

**1. Purpose of the Report**

To determine an application for the grant of a house-to-house collection permit in respect of a company known as Savanna Rags International Ltd. The applicant is Mr Ahmed Suleman of Croft Mill, Forest Road, Mansfield, Nottingham, NG18 4BU.

**2. Options For the Sub-Committee**

The legislation controlling house-to-house collections is the House-To-House Collections Act 1939. This allows for the grant of a permit to enable a house-to-house collection to take place, subject to local Authority policy.

The Sub-Committee may determine the application in one of the following ways:-

**(1) Grant**

The Sub-Committee may grant the application.

If the Sub-Committee decide that to grant the application it should be subject to the standard conditions applicable to house-to-house collection permits.

**(2) Grant subject to special conditions**

The Sub-Committee may grant the permit subject to such variations, conditions or restrictions, as they think fit.

**(3) Refuse**

The Sub-Committee may refuse the application.

In arriving at its decision the Sub-Committee should take into account the written and spoken comments put forward by the applicant and any other circumstances that are presented at the hearing.

The Sub-Committee must give the applicant the reasons for the decision made when it is announced.

### **3. Financial Implications**

None.

### **4. Report**

On 10 February 2006, the Council received an application for the grant of a house-to-house collection permit in respect of Savanna Rags International Ltd, signed by Mr Suleman. The requested area for the collection is the whole of the city and it is proposed to collect 'used clothing, textiles and shoes'.

Savanna Rags International Ltd has a written agreement with the charity Orphan Aid Association. Orphan Aid Association will allow Savanna Rags International Ltd to collect door to door using the charity name and registered charity number on leaflets. Savanna Rags International Ltd will not be collecting on behalf of the Orphan Aid Association. Orphan Aid Association will receive an agreed amount of money of £100 per week regardless of the amount of clothing collected.

A further letter was received from Mr Suleman, which gave details of an approximate weekly collection. Mr Suleman predicted that in winter, they could collect approximately 2000kg and during summer, it could be approximately 3000kg. In total, this could equate to between £1,000 - £1,200 per week. From this amount, Mr Suleman estimates that £350 will cover the cost of the vehicle and two men to collect the clothing.

On receipt of the application and additional information, the application was refused and a copy of this letter is appended to the report. The current policy in relation to deductions from house-to-house collections states that none may be made from the proceeds of such a collection.

A copy of the application form together with information submitted by Orphan Aid Association is appended to this report.

The letter of refusal, dated 8 March 2006, informed the applicant of his right to have the application referred to the Licensing Enforcement Sub-Committee for determination. Mr Suleman of Savanna Rags International Ltd and Mrs Maureen Haddlesey, of Orphan Aid Association then wrote to request the matter be referred to the Sub-Committee. Both letters included additional information about the charity and are appended to this report.

Any additional information received from Mr Suleman in support of the application is appended to this report.

The three pages of guidance notes for organisers of house-to-house collections are appended to this report for information.

## **5. Policy Guidelines**

Leicester City Council has a policy, adopted on 1<sup>st</sup> September 1998, regarding the percentage of deductions from house-to-house collections, which provides that:

'Approval be given to a guideline figure of zero, for remuneration from the proceeds of any house-to-house collection.'

## **6. Legal Implications (including Human Rights Act)**

A licensing decision is also a determination of civil rights to which Article 6 the right to a fair trial applies. Article 8 the right to respect for private and family life applies to the protection on neighbouring properties from noise and disturbance. Article 1 of the First Protocol gives the right of peaceful enjoyment of possessions, which would include a licence. Terms and conditions imposed on the grant of a licence will need to be proportionate, and necessary to protect the interests of a democratic society.

There is a right of appeal against the refusal to grant a house-to-house collection permit and this would be made to the Secretary of State.



Do you receive money for the clothes collected and if so, is the whole of this money given to the charity, Orphan Aid Association.

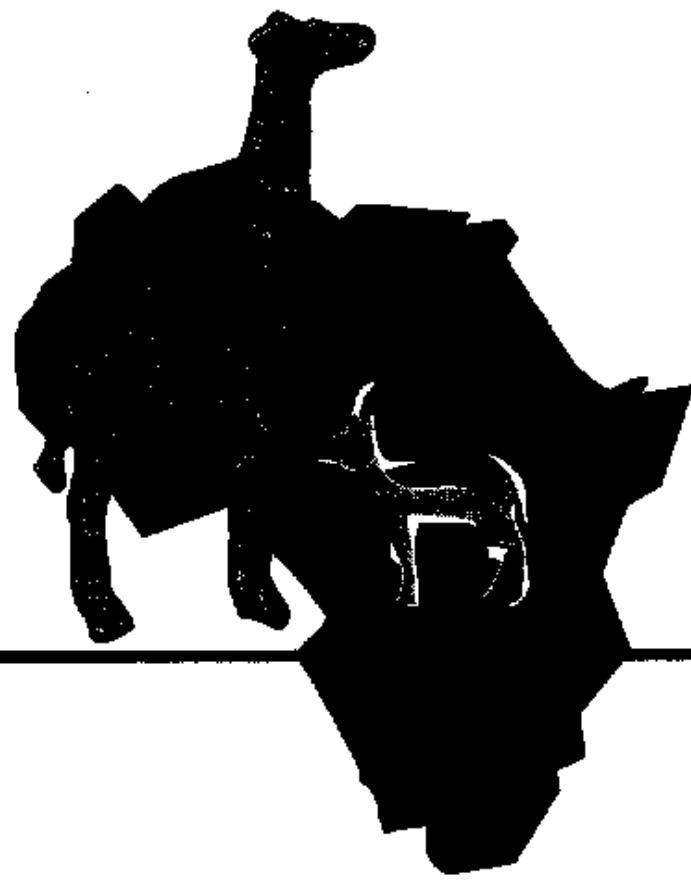

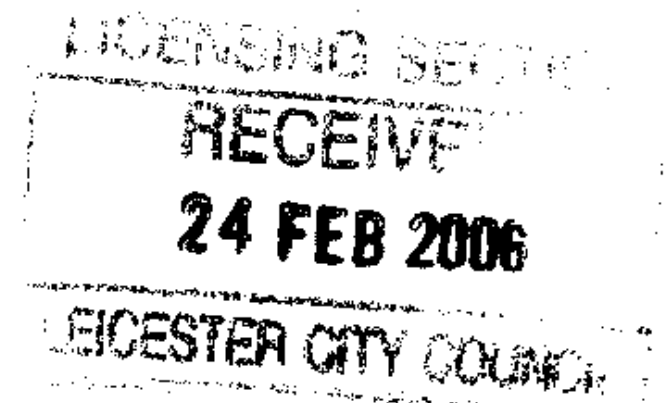

Further to my telephone conversation to you, this is to confirm that we are a recycling company in Mansfield, who employs approximately 70 workers.

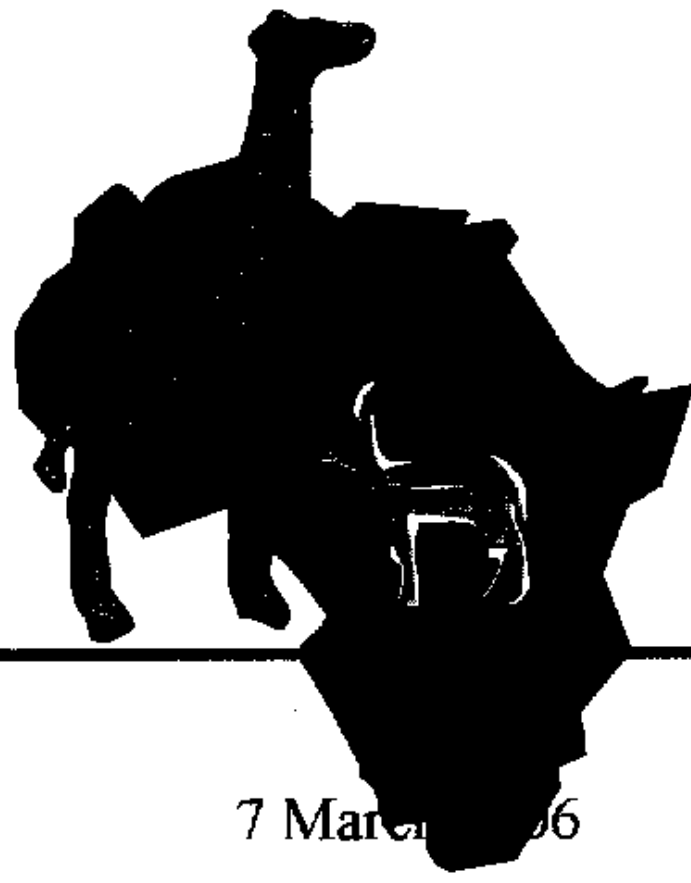

Further to my previous letter to you, we would like to clarify the following points to support our application for House to House collection.

We can only forecast our figures for how much raw material will be collected and our running cost's as we are not experienced in this area at all.

We predict that in the winter we will collect approximately 2000kg and in the summer we will collect approximately 3000kg. In total the gross income expected from this will be £1000- £1200 all figures are weekly presumptions. The estimate cost of running the van with two men to collect will be approximately £350.00 and £100.00 being paid to the charity Orphan Aid on a weekly basis. Please be advised that on our knowledge of this business 5% of all collections is normally unusable due to wet rubbish and damage.

Orphan Aid Organisation will get their fixed fee plus our donations of any books, bric a brac and toys whatever is collected will be passed on to the charity extra funding. The material will be used for processing for export to the Third World Countries.

We have made the above arrangements with the charity but the figures are not confirmed, and will be regarded for debate after a trial run.

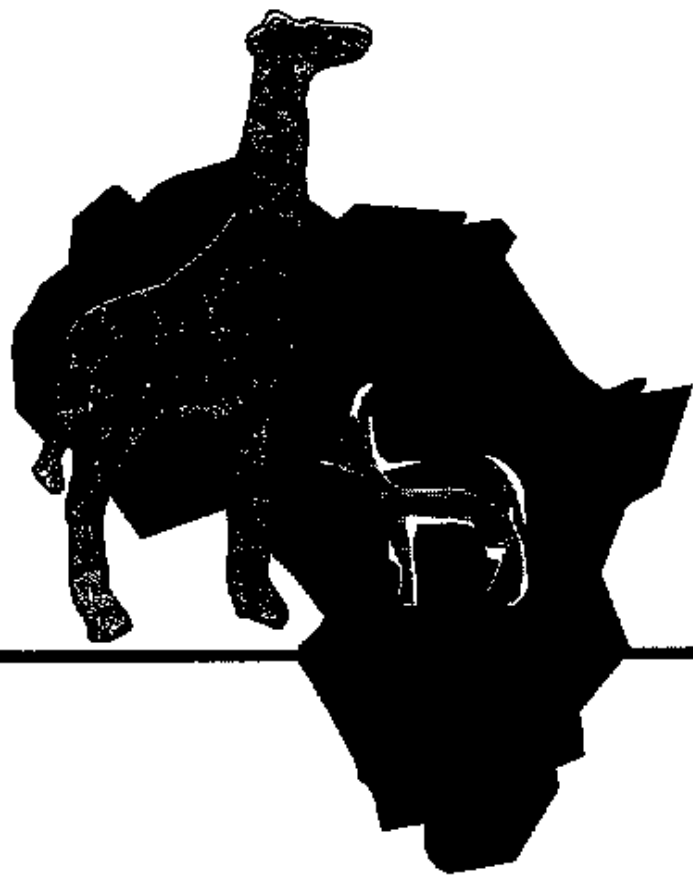
**The application for the grant of a house to house collection permit is therefore refused.**

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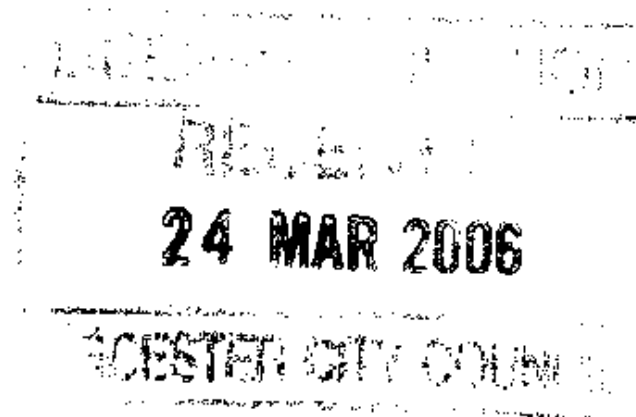

Further to our telephone conversation earlier last week and also following up the letter that you sent to Mr Suleman of Savanna Rags I feel that I need to write this letter to you in order to clarify a few points and also to ask you to re look at the application.

You have actually asked Mr Suleman for a breakdown of monies involved in this collection and to be quite honest with you at this stage this is an impossible question for him to answer as he has never done this type of collection before - although I can tell you from experience that it is not cheap to do as you have to purchase, the leaflets, the bags, the fuel for the vehicle to name but a few things that he will have to pay out as well as paying our charity £100 per week (whether he collects or not).

Mr Suleman is one of the few people that I know that actually wants to do this right and get all the relevant licences/permits that are needed because I am sure like myself you know plenty to people who just collect without a licence who then make it very difficult for the honest people who are around.

We would like to back Mr Sulemans application in whatever way we can and would like to point out to you that if you still insist on refusing him his licence we think your application form should be re-designed as it is very misleading as nowhere does it state that you only supply to registered charities and if this is the case then it is a complete waste of time for people like Mr Suleman to even fill them in.

You have commented to both myself and Mr Suleman that you do not think £100 is enough to give to us - believe me when I say it is - as we also get foreign coins, bric-a-brac, toys, food and some childrens clothing which will in theory add up to a lot more that £100, and our agreement has been okayed by the charity commissioners and our solicitor.

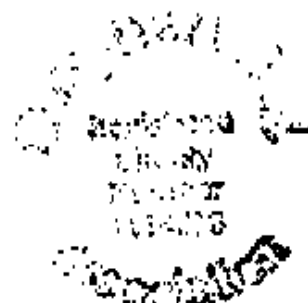
I await your reply and would really appreciate it if you would let the Licensing Enforcement Sub-Committee take a look at this application.

HOUSE TO HOUSE COLLECTIONS ACT 1939

HOUSE TO HOUSE COLLECTIONS REGULATIONS 1947

Notes for the guidance of Organisers of House to House Collections and  
Persons acting as Collectors

1. Every promoter of a collection shall exercise due diligence to secure that person authorised to act as collectors are fit and proper person.
2. A promoter of a collection shall not permit a person to act as a collector unless he has issued or caused to be issued to that person:
  - (a) a prescribed certificate of authority\* completed except as regards the signature of the collector and signed by or on behalf of the promoter of the collection;
  - (b) a prescribed badge, having inserted therein a general indication of the purpose of the collection; and
  - (c) if money is collected, a collecting box or receipt book marked with a clear indication of the purposes of the collection and a distinguished number, which indication and number shall in the case of the receipt book, also be marked on every receipt contained therein in addition to the consecutive number of the receipt.

NOTE: Collections by means of envelopes can only be made where the promoter of a collection to whom an order has been granted informs the Secretary of State that he desires to promote an envelope collection, and where the Secretary of State is of the opinion that the collection is for a charitable purpose of major importance and is suitably administered, the Secretary of State may, if he thinks fit, give permission for the promotion of an envelope collection.

3. Every promoter of a collection shall exercise all due diligence to secure:
  - (a) that no prescribed certificate of authority, prescribed badge, collecting box or receipt book is issued, unless the name and address of the collector to whom it is issued have been entered on a list showing in respect of any collecting box or receipt book distinguished number thereof; and
  - (b) that every prescribed certificate of authority, prescribed badge, collecting box or receipt book issued to him or on his behalf is returned when the collection is completed or when for any reason a collector ceases to act as such.

\* Certificates of authority may be obtained from HMSO, 68-69 Bull Street, Birmingham, B4 6AD.



4. Every collector shall:
  - (a) sign his name on the prescribed certificate or authority issued to him and produce it on the demand of any Police Constable or other officer appointed by the Authority or of any occupant of a house visited by him for the purpose of collection;
  - (b) sign his name on the prescribed badge issued to him and wear the badge prominently whenever he is engaged in collecting; and
  - (c) keep such certificate and badge in his possession and return them to a promoter of the collection on replacement thereof or when the collection is completed or at any other time on the demand of a promoter of the collection.
5. No person under the age of sixteen years shall act or be authorised to act as a collector of money.
6. No collector shall importune any person to the annoyance of such person, or remain in, or at the door of, any house if requested to leave by any occupant thereof.
7.
  - (a) Where a collector is collecting money by means of a collecting box, he shall not receive any contribution save by permitting the person from whom it is received to place it in a collecting box issued to him by a promoter of the collection.
  - (b) Where a collector is collecting money by other means than a collecting box, he shall, upon receiving a contribution from any person, forthwith and in the presence of such person enter on a form of receipt in a receipt book issued to him by the promoter of the collection and on the corresponding counterfoil or duplicate the date, the name of the contributor and the amount contributed, and shall sign the form of receipt, the entries and signature being in ink or indelible pencil and shall and the form of receipt to the person from whom he receives the contribution.
8. Every collector, to whom a collecting box or receipt book has been issued, shall:
  - (a) when the collecting box is full or the receipt book is exhausted, or
  - (b) upon the demand of a promoter of the collection, or
  - (c) when he does not desire to act as a collector, or
  - (d) upon the completion return to a promoter of the collection that collecting box with the seal unbroken or that receipt book with a sum equal to the total amount of the contributions (if any) entered therein.
9.
  - (a) Subject as provided in paragraph (b) of this regulation, a collecting box when returned shall be examined by, and if it contains money, be opened in the presence of, a promoter of the collection and another responsible person.



- (b) Where a collecting box is delivered unopened to a bank, it may be examined and opened by an official of the bank in the absence of a promoter of the collection.
  - (c) As soon as a collecting box has been opened, the contents shall be counted and the amount shall be entered with the distinguishing number of the collection box on a list, which shall be certified by the persons making the examination.
  - (d) Every receipt book when returned and all sums received therewith shall be examined by the promoter of the collection and another responsible person and the amount of the contributions entered in a receipt book shall be checked with the money and entered with the distinguishing number of the receipt book on a list, which shall be certified by the persons making the examination.
10. The chief promoter of a collection in respect of which a licence has been granted, shall furnish an account of the collection on the form provided to the officer of the Authority by which the licence was granted within one month of the expiry of the licence.
11. (a) Every account furnished in compliance with regulation 10 shall be accompanied by vouchers for each item of the expenses and application of the proceeds in the case of a collection and by the list referred to in regulation 3 and the list referred to in regulation 9.
- (b) Paragraph (a) of this regulation shall not apply to an account certified by an auditor who is a member of an association or society of accountants incorporated at the date of these regulations or is on other grounds accepted as competent by the Authority to which the account is submitted, but where in such case the vouchers, receipt books and lists mentioned in the said paragraph (a) are not submitted with an account, the chief promoter shall ensure that they are available for three months after the account is submitted and shall, if the Authority to which the account was submitted so requires at any time within that period, submit them to that Authority.
12. The chief promoter of a collection shall exercise all due diligence to secure that all forms of prescribed certificates of authority and prescribed badges obtained by him for the purpose of the collection are destroyed when no longer required in connection with that collection or in connection with a further collection which he has been authorised to promote for the same purpose.
13. House to House Collections Act 1939 Section 4(3). Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of a regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

Section 8(3). Any person guilty of an offence under subsection (3) of Section 4 of this Act shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding £500.00 (level 2).
